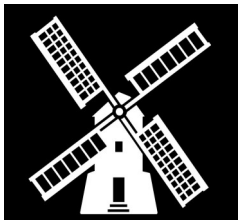

<p>Retell an adult the Alfie's Star story. <i>Use actions too.</i></p>	<p>Go on a shape hunt around your house and record all the shapes you can find. <i>E.g. A clock may be a circle, a book might be a rectangle.</i></p>	<p>Find out some interesting facts about the Great Fire of London and record it on paper.</p>
<p>Rewrite the Alfie's Star Story by adding a new character. <i>For example, a cruel fox finds the star- what does he do with it?</i></p>	<p>Draw various shapes. Draw in any lines of symmetry. Can you halve and quarter the shape? <i>For example, a square has several lines of symmetry and can be halved and quartered in many ways too.</i></p>	<p>Imagine you were experiencing the Great Fire of London. What would you be able to see, hear, smell and feel?</p>
<p>Write a set of instructions about how to look after a dragon. <i>For example: Ensure he has lots of water to cool down his fire.</i></p>	<p>Complete the 'Draw 2d shapes' task on: https://www.deeeningunderstanding.co.uk/</p>	<p>Create a news presentation telling everybody that London is ablaze and what would be happening. <i>This could be filmed and emailed to the school.</i></p>
<p>Write a poem about Flicker in The Boy Who Grew Dragons. <i>Use a range of adjectives and similes. For example- His eyes were as bright as fireworks.</i></p>	<p>Complete the 'Find a half' task on: https://www.deeeningunderstanding.co.uk/</p>	<p>Make an image of the Great Fire of London. <i>This could be a painting, a drawing, using lego, using cardboard boxes or any other way you can think of.</i></p>
