# CLASSROOM NEWS...

## **Year EYFS**

We have had a busy first week back, exploring our new topic book 'Owl Babies'. We looked at how owls are nocturnal and looked at other animals that are too. The children next week will be exploring the meaning of hibernation, and looking at other woodland animals. With Guy Fawkes night coming up, we have been discussing how it is celebrated and talking about the safety of fireworks. The children have been very creative this week, making autumn and firework pictures too.



### Year 1



This week in Year 1 we have moved onto a new text type for our English talk for writing unit. We have been reading and watching different fairy and traditional tales to help us identify the key features these have.

We then will move onto exploring the story of Jack and the Beanstalk to help embed new literacy techniques. In our history lesson this week we explored toys from the past and even got to play with some. The children were very good at Pick up Sticks, however Mr Leonard was not so good. This term our PE units will be Gymnastics and dance and we will be linking the dance to our nativity practices that we started with EYFS. It has been another great week of learning in Year 1 and the children are all coming on very well

### Year 2

I have been so impressed by the learning in Year 2 this week. We have been adding and subtracting two-digit numbers and the children have risen to every challenge I have set them. We have started a new text in English, called 'Elephant Dance' and the children have enjoyed exploring new vocabulary such as monsoon, scurry, garland and procession. I was very impressed with the quality of language and vocabulary used when the children were asked to write a descriptive poem. We started the new half term with a hook day on Monday to launch our new topic based on hot and cold places. We learned about India and the Arctic and we used a very catchy song to learn the name of the 7 continents- in size order! We learned about the equator as well as the terms 'north' and 'south. We can't wait to learn more about the world around us in Geography.
