FOCUSED ON LEARNING!

Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a quieter week at Bocking with our children all focused in class on their learning. As I have wondered in and out of the classes this week I have been impressed with our class learning ambassadors who have been able to very confidently tell me all about their learning and answer any questions I had. Our CEO, Mrs Edom-Baker, who came for a visit today, was also impressed with the children's ability to speak honestly and openly about their learning and she thought the atmosphere across the school was calm and purposeful.

Our teaching staff attended training on Wednesday to learn more about how to teach English through Talk for Writing. The Talk for Writing approach enables children to read and write independently for a variety of audiences and purposes within different subjects. A key feature is that children internalise the language structures needed to write through 'talking the text', as well as close reading. The approach moves from dependence towards independence, with the teacher using shared and guided teaching to develop the ability in children to write creatively and powerfully. You might find that your children can repeat a section of text 'verbatim' and will be able to perform this with actions!

Our year 6 children have been learning all about their upcoming residential trip this week, studying maps of the area they are going to and learning about the local area – we have a full house this year with all children attending and we are very much looking forward to seeing and hearing all about the activities they are taking part in. I will be sending out a parent survey in the summer term to gage opinion on residential trips so we are able to plan ahead and offer further opportunities for other year groups.

In staffing news, we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Moody in Reception class at Easter. We wish her all the very best in her new role and I would like to thank her for all her hard work here at Bocking. Her new school will be very lucky to have her. We are in the midst of recruiting new staff and will let you know of appointments very soon.

We are still looking for volunteers to come in to school to support with learning. This could be hearing readers or supporting with times tables - please let the office know if this is something that you would be interested in helping with.
