

In Maths this week, we have been learning about the different types of angles. We then created our own geometric angle art, once we had added some colour, we tried to identify whether the angles we had created were: acute, obtuse or right angles.


Travelling Book Fair will be coming to school on the 24th June. Children will have the opportunity to look at the books they would like to purchase.


