Year EYFS

We have continued to explore the story of 'Owl Babies' this week, by creating an action story that we will be performing to our year six buddies. Alongside our story in literacy, Miss Freeman has challenged us with lots of phonics activities – our favourite was using the magnetic letters to write words in the play dough. In maths, we have been talking about different shapes. Miss Freeman was pleased to see how many we recognised. With shapes in mind, we looked at the artwork of Wassily Kandinsky and created some of our own, colourful shape pictures. They really were masterpieces!



Year 1





In Year 1, we have continued with our addition and subtraction work. The children are becoming very good at using part-whole models to help solve addition and subtraction problems. In English we have been story mapping 'Jack and the Beanstalk', we then made actions to go with the story to help us remember it. We are also busy working away with our nativity practice and the children are really beginning to showcase there excellent singing and dancing.
