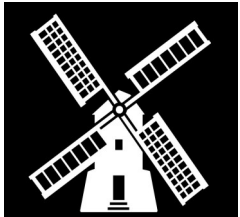

Write a diary entry about the discovery.</p> <p><i>Think back to our diary entry on WW2 for support with the structure of this.</i></p>	<p>Make a teaching video to explain how to perform column addition and subtraction for two 4-digit numbers.</p> <p><i>How many different ways can you show what you mean? Make sure that you use diagrams or write the workings out to help your viewer to understand.</i></p>	<p>Film your own short (maximum 5 mins) documentary on Ancient Maya and email it in.</p> <p><i>Use https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zq6svcw to give you some ideas.</i></p>
<p>Make up your own Mayan God or Goddess. Write a description of them.</p> <p><i>Can you include any expanded noun phrases, adverbs, similes?</i></p>	<p>Create a poster on multiplication and division. What does it help you to do? How do you do it? What do you need to know?</p> <p><i>Use correct terminology and remember to include their meanings.</i></p>	<p>The Maya studied the stars. Google and download "Stellarium" (with adult permission and supervision) and use it to research 3 different constellations.</p> <p><i>Use pictures and key words to explain your findings in a clear way...</i></p>
<p>Create a poster summarising the features of a non-chronological report. Can you give examples that would work well in our key text?</p> <p><i>Remember to think about the features studied in our key text on the Lost Cities of Ancient Maya...</i></p>	<p>Create a toolkit for a new process we have learnt. You can choose from using the inverse, multiplication, division, addition, subtraction, area or perimeter.</p> <p><i>Use pictures and key words to explain the process clearly. Do this like our toolkits that we make in class...</i></p>	<p>Where about in the world did Mayan's live? Use a map to find out. Can you plot different Mayan cities on the map?</p> <p><i>You could use an atlas of google maps to do this...</i></p>
<p>Create a mind map listing Mayan Gods. Then write about what they all have in common and what differences they have.</p> <p><i>Use a table with similarities and differences to help with the second part of the task.</i></p>	<p>Log on to www.deepeningunderstanding.com and complete the multiplication tasks that we have set you.</p>	<p>Draw 3 Mayan hieroglyphs and write down what they mean.</p> <p><i>For some extra challenge, can you write a sentence?</i></p>
