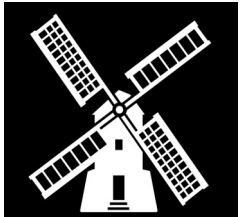

<p>Pretend you are a Victorian school child. Write a diary entry about your day at school. <i>Think back to our diary entry on WW2 for support with the structure of this.</i></p>	<p>Make a maths board game to practice how to perform addition and subtraction of fractions. <i>Make sure that you include instructions of how to play and make sure you know the answers too.</i></p>	<p>How did the Victorians punish those that had committed crimes? Research and present your findings in a short video documentary. <p>Write a fact file on Queen Victoria and her reign. <i>Can you use subheadings, did you know boxes and factual language?</i></p>	<p>Create a poster on fractions and decimals. What do they help you to do? How are they used in real life? What do you need to know? <i>Use correct terminology and remember to include their meanings.</i></p>	<p>Create an outdoor game for Victorian children to play. <i>You will need to think carefully about the toys they had available. Use pictures and key words to explain your game in a clear way</i></p>
<p>Write a paragraph to compare Victorian London to London today. <i>Remember to think about the similarities and differences and use some comparative and contrastive conjunctions and adverbials (whereas, however, similarly...)</i></p>	<p>Create a toolkit for a new process we have learnt. You can choose from using the finding a common denominator, adding/subtracting fractions, place value in decimals, multiplying fractions or dividing fractions. <i>Use pictures and key words to explain the process clearly. Do this like our toolkits that we make in class...</i></p>	<p>Research Victorian money – what coins did they have? How much would they be worth today? What did people get paid for their jobs? How does that compare to today? <i>You could use the internet to do this and present your findings however you like...</i></p>
<p>Create a mind map listing the events of the Industrial Revolution. Then write a sentence for each to explain why it was important. <i>Use the 2012 Olympic opening ceremony to help you if you need to.</i></p>	<p>Log on to <a href="http://www.deepeningunderstanding.com">www.deepeningunderstanding.com</a> and complete the decimal tasks that we have set you.</p>	<p>What did the Victorians eat? Research some of their food and recipes. <i>For some extra challenge, can you even make the recipe?</i></p>
