From Year 2

Year 2 have been exploring the world's continents and oceans. We have worked on our map skills to locate the North and South Pole and we found the UK. We have been developing our fitness in PE by completing exercises such as press ups and Russian twists. In English, we have learned The Enormous Crocodile story with actions—ask your child to show you. In Maths, we have been using all sorts of manipulatives to help us solve multiplication questions and we have identified how to care for a pet in Science.

From Year 3

Year three have ventured deeper into Ancient Egypt this week we have loved reading Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx and we have been using this to inspire our writing. We have discovered lots of new information about the different Egyptian Gods. In our Science lesson we have been investigating forces. We looked at how far toy cars travelled on different surfaces. We loved the chance to carry out a science investigation for ourselves.

From Year 4

In Year 4 we have been learning all about electricity. In Science, we were given lots of equipment and we had to see if we could make the bulb light up. We then had challenges like making a buzzer work, trying to make 2 bulbs light up and to see if we could spot the mistakes in the electric circuits. It was great fun and we loved to explore and experiment with the equipment.








From Year 5

This week Year 5 have been building up to using long multiplication. We have used base ten and place value counters for short multiplication before learning how to multiply a 2 digit number by a 2 digit number, using them too. We then learnt the area model before moving on to long multiplication. In PE, we did our first fitness session. We worked in groups to complete our circuit training and recorded our times. We will compare these in the last week of half term to record our progress.







From Year 6

Year 6 have visited Bocking Cemetery this week to look at the location of a memorial garden which the whole school will be involved in, painting stones to decorate the children's area of this memorial garden. It was interesting to see the location and layout and to also find the war graves and discuss these in relation to our last topic of Building Bocking. We have also been studying the author Malorie Blackman in English and have read two of her books already, empathising with character and discussing themes which run through these stories. In Art we have looked at the work of David Hockney and will be creating some Pop Art of our own next week.
