MINUTES OF PARENTS FORUM HELD ON FRIDAY 17TH MAY 2019

The forum today was led by Mrs Slatter. Mrs Slatter fed back on the actions from the last meeting. Actions from last meeting:

- 1) Demountable classroom the minutes of the forum were emailed to the LA as agreed at the last meeting. We have recently had a H&S compliance visit where Miss Tatlow took the opportunity to discuss the demountables. Photos were taken and the person who visited from the LA was going to take our concerns back to the relevant personnel.
- 2) Front path the front path was swept as requested by a parent at the last forum
- 3) Proud stickers following a discussion with staff the proud stickers have been amended to enable adults to write what the sticker was received for.
- 4) Clubs staff have discussed clubs and we have agreed from Sept to ensure there is a variety of other clubs on offer.
- 5) Year 2 SATs the info leaflet has been distributed to parents. Year 2 have been carrying out SATs this week and a number of parents have feedback to me that their children have been enjoying the week!
- 6) Newsletter rather than using acronyms in the newsletter we are now writing everything long hand.

Discussion from today's meeting:

- 1) 11+ A parent felt that there was a lack of information from the school regarding the 11+. As a school we can only give limited advice regarding the 11+ and guide parents as to where they can obtain further information. The 11+ curriculum is beyond the expectations of the Primary National Curriculum. Further advice can be obtained from https://www.csse.org.uk/. - 2) Road crossing patrol a parent asked about the potential of having a lollipop person. since the meeting we have investigated this and someone from the LA will be visiting to observe both vehicle and pedestrian traffic in the future; however, we were told that it would be unlikely that we would meet criteria.
- 3) <u>Year 6 SATs</u> a parent offered their compliments for staff in year 6 in the preparation for the year 6 children for their SAT's and for the opportunities for the booster sessions that had been offered.
