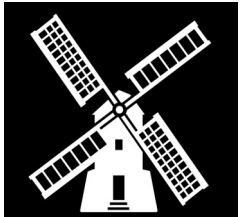

<p>Write a setting description of the Sahara Desert. <i>Can you include any expanded noun phrases, adverbs, similes? You can use phrases from our model text to help.</i></p>	<p>Complete the new fraction tasks set for you on www.deepeningunderstanding.com <i>If you have forgotten your login, I can give you a new one. If you need your toolkit book to help, I will photocopy the pages for you too.</i></p>	<p>Find out about desertification. What is it and why is it happening? Is there a way to stop it from happening?
